

ABOUT THE PRESENTER

Dr. William G. (Bill) Hoy is clinical professor of Medical Humanities at Baylor University and an authority on the role of social support in death, dying and grief.



For more than 30 years, he has walked alongside the dying and bereaved. For 16 years before coming to Baylor in 2012, Dr. Hoy directed the clinical counseling program for a hospice and community bereavement program in Southern California. He has held teaching appointments in end-of-life care and bereavement counseling at Cypress College and Marian University and is the author of more than 100 book chapters, journal articles and educational pamphlets as well as six books.

He holds the Fellow in Thanatology, the advanced practice credential in death, dying and bereavement. Dr. Hoy is considered an authority on funeral rites and their role in social support from both a cross-cultural and historical perspective, having studied memorial rituals in more than 140 people groups.


