As a grief educator, **Harold Ivan Smith, D.Min., FT**, is a wordsmith and storyteller, whether through his speaking, teaching, writing and counseling. Through his word pictures and stories, listeners and readers respond saying, "I never quite thought of it that way before."

Smith is a graduate of The Mid-America College of Funeral Service, Scarritt College (M.A.), George Peabody College of Vanderbilt University (Ed.S.), and has a doctorate from

Asbury Theological Seminary.

Smith is recognized as a Fellow in Thanatology by the Association for Death Education and Counseling. He is a member of the faculty of the American Academy of Grief/CMI and teaches continuing education courses for psychologists, social workers, nurses, and pastoral care counselors across the United States. He has served on the Board of the Association for Death Education and Counseling and serves on the board of the Grief Support Network in Kansas City.

He teaches an innovative course, "Grief in the Workplace," at MidAmerica Nazarene University in Kansas.

As a gifted storyteller and researcher in the use of "story telling" in grief resolution, he has pioneered the use of children's books with adult grievers. He leads Grief Gatherings--innovative storytelling groups at Saint Luke's Hospital in Kansas City, Missouri, where he is a member of the teaching faculty.

Smith has written more than 15 books about grief and has been published in more than six languages.
